CONSIDERATIONS WHEN PLANNING GRADE 11 AND 12

- UBC recommends 6 grade 12 level classes, academic and/or non-academic to demonstrate course load. (English 12 +5) This is separate from all other Transcript evaluations.
- **Research subject categories** applicable to the degree & campus to which you wish to apply.
- **Research the degree specific requirements** applicable to the degree and campus you wish to apply.

 - Min '3' on Literacy 12 assessment
 - Breadth(# of courses)
 - Depth(Calculus 12, AP, Dual Credit)
