How do my marks go to post-secondary institutions?

Your school marks are protected under privacy laws.
You must GIVE PERMISSION to the Ministry of Education to share your marks with post-secondary institutions.

- Transcripts are sent electronically to post-secondary institutions according to the SEND OPTION that the PSI has chosen.
- Do not adjust the default send option and/or date range the post-secondary school has already set.

Example: "Send my transcript now and allow this post-secondary Institution to request updates until the date specified below" (*can be a 1 year timeline)

**DO NOT SELECT:

"Send my transcript electronically now" or "Send my printed transcript now" as these selections are for students who have already graduated

BC Achievement Scholarship

\$1250 scholarship awarded to the TOP 8000 BC students

- This scholarship recognizes achievement in Grade 10, 11, and 12 courses meeting graduation program requirements, including electives.
- Cumulative average percentage will be calculated by Ministry.
- Eligibility requirements:
 - Must be a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident
 - Must be a BC resident
 - Have a "B" (73%) or better in Language Arts 12 course

BC Excellence Scholarship

\$5000 scholarship awarded to 55 students in BC

- This scholarship recognizes well-rounded graduates demonstrating community services and a broader range of experiences count with leadership both inside and outside of school, as well as an aptitude and commitment to their chosen career path.
- Students must:
 - Be in their graduation year
 - Have a "B" average in Grade 11 and 12 courses required for Graduation
 - Minimum (73% or above" in English 12 / EFP 12
 - Minimum "B" average, no more than one "C+" & nothing lower than "C+" in Science 11/12, Math 11, SS 11/12
 - Submit a resume & a written statement describing accomplishments
 - Provide 2 references- one from school, one from community

Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship

\$1250 scholarship (approx. 15 / year to GESS)



- Both BC and Canada provide student loans, integrated in BC as a single loan to streamline the service delivery. Students sign a joint federal-provincial loan agreement and have a single point of contact for managing their loans. At the point of loan repayment, students make just one monthly payment towards their integrated loan balance.
- These loans are based on financial need and are interest-free while you are enrolled in fulltime study.
- One application to StudentAidBC covers both the BC and Canada student loan programs.
- StudentAidBC helps with the cost of post-secondary education through student loans, grants, scholarships and other non-repayable financial supports. They also have programs that help with loan repayment. Use this site to determine your eligibility and information on how to apply.

CENTRAL OKANAGAN BURSARY AND SCHOLARSHIP SOCIETY

- Unique to the Central Okanagan
- One application allows students to apply to hundreds of awards
- There are 2 types of awards
 - No criteria awards which are open to all students
 - Specific criteria awards which have been established by donors

ELIGIBILITY

- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or refugee living within the boundaries of Central Okanagan Public Schools.
- 2. Must be applying/have applied and plan to attend <u>FULL</u> <u>TIME</u> at an accredited post-secondary institution in September of graduation year.
- 3. Obtain a minimum of 60% average in all grade 11 and 12 courses.
- 4. Registered in a minimum of six (6) courses during grade 12 year and will complete a minimum of six (6) courses by June 30th not including the grade 12 Capstone Careers course.
- 5. Have potential to graduate for the first time this June.
- 6. Attending one of the member schools of COBSS as their home school during graduation year.

SELECTION PROCESS

- Applications are submitted <u>online</u>.
- Applications are strictly confidential.
- Applications are read only by school counsellors, donors and members of the COBSS selection committee consisting of representatives from each of the member schools.



School counsellors are not part of the selection process.

1. FINANCIAL NEED

based on line 150 of tax return and any special circumstances

2. ACADEMIC ABILITY

the average of student's Grade 11 and Grade 12 marks

TIP: Compose paragraphs in a Word Document, and then cut and paste into COBSS application.

- Space is limited so write concisely as there are a maximum number of characters available.
- Please check spelling, grammar and punctuation.

One **critical** component of the application is the paragraph answers under **Student Personal Statements**.

There are 3 questions you will need to answer in this section.

- This is where your personality shows through and helps the committee with its decision.
- BE CREATIVE, HONEST and CONCISE and remember to proofread your answers.
- With your words, you are trying to create a vision in the donor's mind of who you are, what your goals and dreams are and why you deserve to be selected for the award.

QUESTION 1:

What are your educational/career plans? Describe the experiences that have contributed to these plans.

- Try to be original and creative.
- Do not start with "My name is____ and I am in grade 12 at ____."

QUESTION 2:

For the selection committee, describe the three qualities that best demonstrate your character. Use examples from your life to illustrate these qualities.

- Try to get across who you are and what you are about in words.
- You want to stand out in the sea of applications.

QUESTION 3:

Describe your family (include custodial and non-custodial parent information). Explain any financial and non-financial struggles that you may have encountered.

- Remember that financial need is one of the areas that selection is based on for COBSS awards.
- This is a snapshot of your current family and financial situation.

Another important part of the application is Your Activity Details.

Students will include their activities from grades 10, 11 & 12 in the following three areas:

- Community / School Based Involvement & Achievements
- 2. Volunteer Experience
- 3. Paid Work Experience

Under each activity heading, list (up to)

3 of the MOST SIGNIFICANT activities in which you have been involved. (no more than 3)


For each activity, list in this order:

- 1. Organization
- 2. Your activities/responsibilities/duties
- 3. Dates (mm/yyyy-mm/yyyy)
- 4. Estimated total activity hours (per week)
- 5. Total overall hours

TIP:

 Note your awards (file, binder, phone notes, etc.) so that you can track them accurately and use them before they expire.



Question:

When should I begin my COBSS application?

Answer:

It is recommended to begin the application as soon as possible. It is a lengthy process which takes a number of separate sittings to complete. It cannot be completed in one sitting.

Question:

When will I know if I have received a COBSS award?

Answer:

Awards are typically presented to individual student recipients at either the school graduation ceremonies or a separate awards night. Check with your school.

Question:

Will my COBSS award expire?

Answer:

Yes. COBSS awards presented this year are valid until December 1st of your graduation year.

Question:

Can I take a year off for an exchange, a gap year, missionary work, etc. and still use my COBSS award?

Answer:

No, COBSS awards given out this year are valid until December 1st of your graduation year.

Question:

How do I know if the school I plan to attend is accredited as required for my COBSS eligibility.

Answer:

On the COBSS website is this link to search accredited institutions.



Question:

What do I do with a COBSS award?

Answer:

A COBSS award recipient receives a voucher called a Certificate of Award (COA). To redeem the award at the post secondary school, a student can do **one** of the following:

1. Take the COA to the registrar of the post secondary to be validated and sent by the post secondary school to COBSS for payment.

Answer (con't):

- 2. If the registrar of the post secondary school will not send the validated COA to COBBS, then the student must return the validated COA via:
- mail
- scan and email OR
- drop off at the COBSS office

Answer (con't):

- **3.** If the registrar will not validate the COA, the student needs to return two forms to COBSS:
- the COA and
- a Verification of Enrolment form from the post secondary school

AWARD RECIPIENTS
